MACPAC Report Reviews Medicaid's Role in Behavioral Health Services

The annual study examines Medicaid's performance in an effort to improve and manage care for its beneficiaries. The findings show that populations from low-income children to the elderly have a high level of unmet needs for mental health care. Additionally, the review of Medicaid's dental coverage for adults found considerable variation between states.

GAO Report Examines Unmet Services

This report, published by the Government Accountability Office found that almost 4 million seniors are faced with food insecurity. Findings showed that 1 in 5 seniors did not know where their next meal would come from and were in need of transportation services. However, some improvement was seen with home-based care. This report indicates that the funding for the Older Americans Act program is not sufficient for the increasing population.

Oral Health and Primary Care

A report by the U.S. Department of Health and Human services and a white paper commissioned by the National Interprofessional Initiative on Oral Health both examine the wide disparities in oral health due to lack of access. The U.S. fails to provide proper access for ongoing and preventative oral health care needs. A push must be made to integrate dental care as a component of primary care. There is also a focus on the impact and burden of oral diseases and its affect on quality of life.

President Declares World Elder Abuse Awareness Day

President Barack Obama declared June 15, 2015, as World Elder Abuse Awareness Day in a proclamation issued this week. This day is dedicated to increase the awareness of elder abuse and

combat it to protect our elders. The President cited elder abuse as "an affront to human rights around the world" and highlighted the necessity of improving conditions and services for older adults as a priority for this administration.

Labor, Health and Human Services Appropriations Bill

The House Appropriations Committee released the draft funding bill for the 2016 fiscal year. A bulk of the increase supports the transition programs under the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act from the Department of Education to ACL, and the transfer of the Traumatic Brain Injury program from HRSA to ACL. The bill provides a \$2.5 million increase for Congregate Meals and a \$3.5 million increase for the Meals on Wheels program.

Elder Justice Coalition

Getting Serious About Elder Abuse

Bob Blancato, National Coordinator of the Elder Justice Coalition and Executive Director of the National Association of Nutrition and Aging Services Programs, calls attention to the pervasive and growing problem of elder abuse in the United States in his recently published [article in Forbes](#). Nearly 6 million elder abuse cases occur each year, and in the form of financial exploitation, abuse victims lose an estimated \$3 billion a year.

As part of World Elder Abuse Awareness Day on June 15, the White House hosted an elder justice meeting and a congressional reception was held. Awareness is a start, Blancato argues, but more needs to be done in terms of funding the services and centers that prevent and fight elder abuse.
