Hello,

Hope you are well today. We are seeking additional information on how the state responded to the devastation caused by Hurricane Matthew:

- We know that DSNAP was not requested by the Governor's office and other than a comment about it not going well last year, there was no elaboration on that comment. Was it because of the fraud cases last year?
- Has the state requested any help from FEMA's Critical Needs Assistance for Displaced Individuals and Households that provides \$500 to storm disaster victims displaced from their homes? If so, when? If not, why?
- Has the state requested help from FEMA's Manufactured Housing Units? If so, when? If not, why?
- If the state doesn't use FEMA's manufactured housing units, is there a temporary Housing Plan for those displaced by storm? What will happen to them when those temporary places of housing can no longer help them?
- How has the state's Long Term Housing Task Force, established last October following record flooding, assessed Hurricane Matthews's impact? Is there a preliminary report we can have access to?
- Has the state requested any help through FEMA's National Mass Care Strategy program. If so, when? If not, why?
- What is the state's own Voluntary Agency Liaison (VAL) doing to address the situation? Is there a preliminary report we can have access to?

Should there be any unreasonable fees associated with this request, please contact requester prior to release. If my request is denied in whole or part, I ask that you justify all deletions by reference to specific exemptions of the act.
