State of Tourism in SC to be presented at Conference

At the [Governor's Conference on Tourism and Travel](#) next month in [Spartanburg](#), I will give an update on the status of tourism in South Carolina, reviewing the successes and challenges of the past year and presenting great ideas for the future.

As you know from the indicators we publish every month in this e-newsletter, our single most successful metric right now is RevPAR, which is the total amount of room revenue collected divided by the total number of room nights available. I will discuss how that strong performance contributes to our fourth consecutive year of tourism growth in South

January 26, 2017

Statewide Hotel RevPar -- Boosted by hotel bookings rescheduled due to Hurricane Matthew as well as room rentals for FEMA officials, insurance adjusters, repair workers and others, November 2016 RevPAR exceeded the same month in 2015 by double-digits.

Admissions Tax -- An admissions tax report was not available for the month of November as upgrades are made to the tax processing system.

State Parks Revenue -- A major revenue hit was felt in state parks in November as refunds were processed after Hurricane Matthew. The fire at Table Rock also contributed to a decrease in revenue. All parks that were not affected by the hurricane or the fire reported increases in revenue.

Deplanements

Charleston International Airport reported a 10% increase in deplanements in November, and contributed to an overall 6.1% increase for the month statewide. Year-to-date, deplanements are up statewide by 6.2%.

Occupancy Forecast

STR, Inc., forecasts hotel business during late winter / early spring in South Carolina to be similar to last year's.
