Rebecca,

Attached is a copy of what we sent to the Governor's Office the last time we worked up a non-federal share request based on a federal declaration for review and information. Note there is a base letter, adjusted summary, and a final cost share spreadsheet. We will do something similar for this disaster but remain in the information gathering mode. We can make some estimates but we won't be real comfortable with the numbers for some time. Please note on the attached example, even with a 10% cost overrun, the final numbers indicated almost another 10% variance. Notwithstanding, we will work up some options for consideration.

I think we will get some additional input from both county administrators and emergency managers asking that the state pick up the full 25% cost share similar to the one from Aiken. I will forward anything I get to you but expect many counties will send directly to the Governor. I will ask that the counties send anything to your attention.
