Attached is a memo explaining the answers to these questions in more detail, along with information that is cited in the memo.

The answers to these questions are:

1. Does federal law allow the exclusion of federal benefits by a state to individuals legally in this country?

ANSWER: Sometimes—it depends on how the individual is categorized for immigration purposes. Presumably, the real question is whether the law “allows” exclusion of federal benefits to *refugees*, which are

categorized as “qualified” immigrants. “Qualified” immigrants, like refugees, are entitled to the federal benefits we are generally discussing (SNAP, TANF, Medicaid, etc.). Consequently, if the state refuses to provide benefits to entitled individuals, the state risks being subjected to federal enforcement mechanisms, discussed more fully below and in the memo.

2. If a state should choose to exclude federal benefits to individuals legally in this country, would that action result in a loss of federal funds for the agency?

ANSWER: Not automatically, but it would subject the state agency to the potential loss of federal funds as an enforcement mechanism. The federal regulations prohibit illegal discriminatory practices in the manner of providing services/benefits. One such discriminatory basis is the individual applicant's *national origin*. FNS has taken the position with the state of Georgia that withholding benefits from refugees may be a violation of civil rights (e.g., discrimination based on national origin). As a result, the federal government could withhold administrative funding from a state found to be engaged in such practices. If a recipient of federal assistance funds is found to have discriminated and voluntary compliance cannot be achieved through the federal agency providing the assistance (the administrative remedy), the agency may either initiate fund termination proceedings (described more fully in the memo) or refer the matter to the Department of Justice for appropriate legal action (legal/judicial remedy).
