Dear Ms. Graver:

At the request of your husband, Robert, Congressman Wilson asked our agency to respond to your questions regarding Medicaid eligibility and the healthcare needs of you and your son, Codei.

The Medicaid application for you and Codei was denied on March 27, 2009, because you do not meet citizenship requirements. According to Medicaid policy, a qualified alien must have entered the United States before August 22, 1996; otherwise, there is a disqualification period during which time you may be eligible for *emergency services only*.

According to our records, you and Codei entered this country on September 16, 2007. The disqualification period begins on this date. After a 5-year period, you could obtain qualified alien status if you have also paid Social Security taxes for 40 work quarters. As a qualified alien you could qualify for full Medicaid benefits if you meet all other eligibility criteria.

Even though you are not currently eligible for full Medicaid benefits, once your baby is born, you should reapply for *emergency services only* as we may be able to cover the costs of labor and delivery. Please call your eligibility worker, Christine Buckner, at (843) 726-7747 if you have questions.

In an effort to be of assistance, we contacted Beaufort-Jasper-Hampton Comprehensive Health Services to determine if they could provide prenatal services during your pregnancy. They may be able to offer assistance. For more information about the prenatal services, please call (843) 987-7400.

Enclosed is information on other programs and organizations that can assist residents in South Carolina with their healthcare services, prescriptions, inpatient hospitalization and daily living needs. Thank you for contacting our agency on behalf of Mr. Robert Graver and his wife Melishia and son, Codei, regarding Medicaid eligibility and their healthcare needs.

According to Medicaid policy, a qualified alien must have entered the United States before August 22, 1996; otherwise, there is a disqualification period during which time the individual may be eligible for *emergency services only*. After a 5-year period, the individual can obtain "qualified" alien status if he or she has also paid Social Security taxes for 40 working quarters. As a qualified alien an individual could qualify for full Medicaid benefits if all other eligibility criteria is met.

A member of my staff has been in direct contact with Mr. Graver regarding Medicaid policy and eligibility requirements. We mailed him information on other programs and organizations that can assist residents in South Carolina with their health services, prescriptions, inpatient hospitalization, and daily living needs.

Thank you for your continued interest and support of the South Carolina Medicaid program. If I may be of further assistance on this or any other matter, please let me know.
