As we discussed, the City got an estimate from R.L. Morrison and Sons, the contractor that has been awarded the job to repair the burned out areas of the harborwalk, to clear the debris in the river between the Harborwalk and the shore. The estimate was for \$84,473. Also they would not be able to start for three weeks. In light of this we feel we have to go with Guard for costs and time benefits.

Please advise Gov. Haley of this and of our request that she sign the executive order so we may move forward with the Guard.
