This webinar will provide participants with information on the program Maximizing Independence (MIND) at Home. MIND at Home uses evidence-supported care practices with people with dementia to determine if these could delay or prevent the need to move from home to another setting, such as an assisted living facility or nursing home. Dr. Quincy Samus will present at this webinar.

Dr. Quincy Samus, an Associate Professor in the Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences, is an applied gerontologist, trained in epidemiology and health services research. She has served as PI or Investigator on numerous research projects focused on quality of care and delivery of health services to older adults and families affected primarily dementia, living in community and residential settings. She directs the Translational Aging Services Core (TASC) which aims to support development and evaluation of innovative, evidence-based practices that address the diverse needs of older adults with mental health conditions, their families, and caregivers and has worked directly with a variety of community stakeholders. The overarching goal of her work is to improve care through translation of evidence-based research.
