Dear Christian Soura and Tony Kester,

AARP, with funding from The Commonwealth Fund and The SCAN Foundation, is collecting data for the 3rd edition of the State Scorecard on Long-Term Services and Supports (LTSS) for Older Adults, People with Physical Disabilities, and Family Caregivers. The purpose of the Scorecard is to help policymakers, stakeholders, and advocates analyze state LTSS systems and target areas for improvement.

The LTSS scorecard measures performance across five key dimensions: (1) affordability and access, (2) choice of setting and provider, (3) quality of life and quality of care, (4) support for family caregivers, and (5) effective transitions. We are writing to request your assistance in providing data from your state to inform the **access** dimension of the scorecard which includes a measure of the level of sophistication of your state's No Wrong Door (NWD) System/ Aging and Disability Resource Center (ADRC) System.

To help facilitate the data collection process, we have attached the NWD System Key Elements document. The NWD System Key Elements provide a vision that all states can use, building on their past investments, current policies, and unique structures. We recognize it will take many years for most states to fully achieve the vision. The scorecard survey, based on the NWD System Key Elements, establishes a new baseline for

State NWD/ADRC Systems, and is organized around the four key functions described in the NWD System Key Elements: State Governance and Administration; Public Outreach and Coordination with Key Referral Sources; Person Centered Counseling; and Streamlined Eligibility for Public Programs. In addition the survey asks about the NWD System statewide reach and includes a section assessing the state's ability and plans to track certain quantitative measures.

The expectation is that each state will submit **one** collaborative response to the survey involving input from key agencies. Please use the attached word document to plan your responses with your partners, develop one state response, and enter your response at https://www.research.net/r/AARP_NWD_System
