

Day Care Center Will Stage Open House

An Open House will be held Sunday by the inter-church organization which works to provide day care for children or needy children in the Columbia area.

The Columbia Day Care Project Inc. open house is scheduled from 3 to 5 p.m. at the Gonzales Gardens Day Care Center, which provides day care services for 85 children.

The program is designed to give members of the sponsoring 27 congregations and other interested persons in the community an opportunity "to see what has been accomplished through church contributions and volunteer services."

The center is one of four day care centers now sponsored by the organization. Others are located at Hendley Homes, Saxon Homes, and Camp Fornance, now Broad River Terrace.

Board members, center staff and parents will be on hand to answer questions and talk about the program at the center at Gonzales Gardens on Forest Drive across from Providence Hospital.
