America's services sector generated \$710 billion in exports in 2014, supporting millions of American jobs, including nearly 1.5 million jobs in South Carolina. Since 2006, South Carolina has seen a rise in overall [services exports](#) – boosting state economic growth and jobs, and contributing to the overall U. S. services trade surplus, which reached over \$200 billion in 2013.

To help ensure that America's services companies are able to compete effectively now and in the future, Congress must pass Trade Promotion Authority legislation.
