I'm working on a story about rural teacher housing, specifically the teacher lofts in Saluda (funded by a combo of state \$ and a private match). Rural areas struggle with teacher recruitment, and one of the problems they face is a lack of affordable places for teachers to live. The idea was that this arrangement would be replicated statewide (former state Super Jim Rex was a big supporter of this concept), but that didn't happen.
