Draft Bullets for NYT:

- The State of South Carolina has an international presence in Europe, China, Japan and India, with the state's representation in India coming online under Governor Nikki Haley's administration.
- Governor Nikki Haley participated in the following Commerce-related international trips:
 - 2011: Paris air show/BMW's Munich HQ
 - 2012: London air show
 - 2012: Tokyo trade mission – SEUS Japan
 - 2013: Frankfurt auto show
 - 2014: Canada trade mission
 - 2014: India trade mission
 - 2015: Sweden (Volvo plant negotiations)
 - 2015: Frankfurt auto show/Sweden trade mission
- Since 2011, when Governor Nikki Haley took office, South Carolina has recruited more than \$13 billion in foreign direct investment, bringing approximately 30,000 new jobs to the state.
- Since 2011, nearly 200 companies from more than 30 countries have announced economic development projects in South Carolina.
- IBM-Plant Location International reports in 2012, 2013 and 2015 ranked South Carolina first in the nation for attracting jobs through foreign investment, on a per capita basis.
- More than 700 international firms from 40 countries operate approximately 1,200 facilities in South Carolina. These firms employ more than 130,000 workers – accounting for seven percent of the state's total private employment.

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
