**2002-2003 South Carolina HOPE Scholarship Program**

The South Carolina HOPE Scholarship was established under the S.C. Education Lottery Act in 2001. It is a merit-based scholarship program designed to provide financial assistance to first-time entering freshmen who do not qualify for the LIFE or Palmetto Fellows Scholarship upon graduating from high school. The General Assembly authorized funding in the amount of up to \$2,500 (not to exceed the cost of attendance), plus a \$150 book allowance for the first-year of attendance only. The scholarship may only be awarded to students attending an eligible four-year public or independent institution.

The HOPE Scholarship Program was implemented for the first-time during the 2002-03 academic year. In order to be eligible for the scholarship, a student is required to meet ALL of the following minimum requirements:

- Earn a 3.0 cumulative GPA on a 4.0 scale at the end of the senior year;
- Graduate from high school or complete a home school program as prescribed by law;
- Attend an eligible South Carolina four-year public institution as defined in Section 59-103-5 or a four-year independent institution as defined in Section 59-113-50
- Be a South Carolina resident at the time of high school graduation and at the time of college enrollment;
- Be a U.S. citizen or permanent resident who meets the definition of an eligible non-citizen under State residency statutes;
- Enroll as a full-time (minimum 12 credit hours) degree-seeking student;
- Certify that he or she has not been convicted of any felonies and has not been convicted of any alcohol or drug-related misdemeanor offenses within the past academic year;
- Certify that he or she is not in default and does not owe a refund or repayment on any Federal or State financial aid; and
- Must not be a LIFE or Palmetto Fellows Scholarship recipient.

The S.C. HOPE Scholarship is a one-year program. However, if the student earns 30 credit hours and a cumulative 3.0 Grade Point Average (GPA) by the end of the freshmen year, the student may earn the LIFE Scholarship during the sophomore year.

As of August 31, 2003, the Commission on Higher Education awarded 2,196 students, totaling \$5.4 million for the 2002-2003 academic year. The following reports provide additional information regarding the 2002-2003 HOPE Scholarship recipients including: number of students awarded and the amount disbursed by institution; recipients by ethnicity; recipients by gender; and recipients by county of origin.
