South Carolina's Governor proclaimed March as Red Cross Month in South Carolina Friday, recognizing the daily efforts of the American Red Cross providing disaster assistance or life-saving blood. Meeting with Red Cross volunteers and staff at the capitol Friday, Gov. Nikki Haley thanked them for the work done by the Red Cross. This year's theme is "Not All Heroes Wear Capes" and honors the Red Cross volunteers who donate blood, platelets, their time and resources to support the Red Cross.

**Note:** "Whether it's the Front Street fires in Georgetown or the recent winter storms, the Red Cross is always there," Gov. Haley said.

The Obama administration on Monday pulled back from possible changes to the popular Medicare Part D prescription drug program, saying it would not finalize proposals that have spawned fierce opposition from a broad coalition of interests. Marilyn Tavenner, administrator of the U.S. Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS), said in a letter to members of Congress that her agency had decided not to move forward at present.
