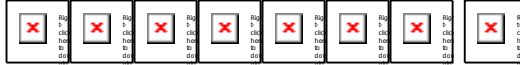

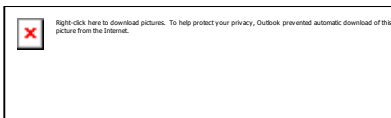
Join Dr. Bogdan Savych, an author and economist at WCRI, for a one-hour webinar on **Thursday, July 28, 2016 at 2pm ET (1pm CT; 12pm MT; 11am PT)** as he discusses findings from our recently published worker outcomes studies.

The research compares outcomes of injured workers across 15 states, and includes such metrics as recovery of physical health and functioning, return to work, earnings recovery, access to medical care, and satisfaction with medical care.

The 15 states included in the research are Arkansas, Connecticut, Florida, Georgia, Indiana, Iowa, Kentucky, Massachusetts, Michigan, Minnesota, North Carolina, Pennsylvania, Tennessee, Virginia, and Wisconsin.

**Questions addressed:**

- In what states did injured workers report higher rates of being able to go back to work and stay employed after initial return to work?
- How did recovery of physical health and functioning vary across study states?
- In what states did injured workers report higher rates of experiencing "big problems" getting desired medical care?
- What percentage of injured workers across the 15 states was satisfied with their overall medical care?

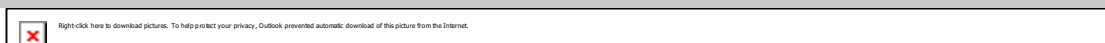


**Currently, 75 people are registered for the webinar and the limit is 100 so don't delay. Click on the link above to register now.**
