Budget Follow-Up for Lt. Governor

1. Proviso regarding LIHEAP and weatherization.

The Governor's Office of Executive Policy and Programs is directed to transfer to the Lt. Governor's Office on Aging the first ten percent of funds awarded by the US Department of Health and Human Services Low Income Heating Assistance Program, (LIHEAP), for the purpose of serving seniors, ages sixty and above, with energy assistance. An additional five percent must also be transferred to serve those households where a disabled resident is in the household. It is further directed that the same percentages are transferred from the funds awarded by the US Department of Energy for the Weatherization Program. The Lieutenant Governor's Office on Aging will report back to the Governor's Office of Executive Policy and Programs, in a manner agreed upon by the two agencies, an accounting of those clients served for the purpose of avoiding duplication of services.
