Late reports could impact your unemployment taxes

With the upcoming tax deadline approaching, do not be delinquent on your reporting. If on the rate computation date, you fail to file any quarterly report that is to be used to determine the tax rate, a delinquent tax rate class 20 will be assigned for the period in which the computation applies. That could bump your tax to a maximum of \$764.40 per employee. See the 2016 tax rate table [here](#). Also if you have a tax execution on file against you account a delinquent tax rate class 20 will be assigned until the quarter in which the tax lien is paid. Employment levels continue rising in January

South Carolina's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate in January remained unchanged at 5.5 percent from December 2015. However, the number of people working increased by 10,853, setting a new record of 2,149,850. Since January 2015, employment gains totaled 50,114, and the level of the unemployed decreased by 22,128 people.
