

A Brief History

For over 80 years, the Bethlehem Center has been a safe haven, providing quality services and programs for the community. The programs and services are especially geared to residents of Spartanburg County with financial challenges and/or hardships, with a focus on providing services to assist families with upward mobility and improving their quality of life.



PROGRAMS AND SERVICES

Outreach

The Food Pantry operates three days a week (Monday, Tuesday and Thursday) between the hours of 9:00 am to 12:00 pm. Individuals in need of emergency food assistance are able to obtain non-perishable food items, as well as fresh bread and vegetables (when available). All recipients are required to present a state issued picture ID, social security card, proof of household income and proof of address.

Senior Wellness

The Center's senior program promotes activities and partnerships that provide mobility and access to physical, social and spiritual wellness activities. The senior wellness program allows seniors to interact with other seniors with similar interests and experiences in a setting outside of their homes while also being physically active and engaged in the community.

After School Program

The After School Program operates year round at no cost to the parent and serves children between the ages of 5 to 13. The after school program offers students daily homework assistance, academic enrichment, age appropriate activities, weekly life skills activities and character education lessons, as well as the opportunity to participate in recreational activities.

During the summer a six week day camp is provided and supervised by the City of Spartanburg.

Specialized Training

EKG, Medication Administration, C.N.A and Phlebotomy training is held on-site in an effort to enhance employment training skills for individuals interested in a career in the healthcare field.
