Good afternoon Lily,

I wanted to bring you up-to-speed on where we are with the Anderson Career and Technology Students coming to Columbia. I received confirmation that they are able to come to Columbia tomorrow (5/11). The plan is for them to meet me here in our office on Lady Street between 9:30-9:45am and then we will walk to the State House by 10am.

I can bring the students by your office and we can go from there since everything is kind of in the air for you tomorrow. If at all possible, it would be wonderful if the Lt. Governor could take a picture with the students and make mention that students from Anderson are visiting.

Students attend the Anderson Career and Technology Center for their ProStart class. Their home schools are Wren High School, Palmetto High School, Powdersville High School, Belton-Honea Path High School and Powdersville High School. There are eight students total and they are being escorted by Hollie Harrell, the director of the career center. Katie and I will also be with them. I have attached a team photo that was taken following the awards ceremony.

Our legislative liaisons are working on the House side with their representatives to also have them introduced as well.

To help with talking point for the Lt. Governor here are a few key items:

ProStart is a nationwide program that introduces restaurant management culinary arts to high school students. There are more than 150,000 students enrolled each year around the country and on DOD bases around the world. South Carolina has 63 programs and almost 3,000 students.

The significance of the students and why they are being honored is that they were just awarded medals in the recent National ProStart invitational. Of the teams that competed, South Carolina team was the only team to take home two medals out of 93 other teams.

The teams faced off against more than 400 students from across the country (and even Guam) at the championship that features two separate competitions: The management competition, which requires

participants to develop and defend a business proposal for a restaurant, and the culinary competition, in which teams are allotted 60 minutes to prepare a three-course meal without access to electricity or running water.

The students received individual medals as well as scholarships at the event that was held a couple of weeks ago in Charleston.
