Re: SC Senate District #20 Primary Run-off on August 28, 2018

Dear Evangelical Christian pastors with churches meeting in vicinity of SC Senate District #20:

Two days ago Tuesday, August 14, the Lord brought a partial victory (so far) in the SC Senate District #20

GOP Primary. Of the four Republican candidates, only two had signed pledges committing to support the

Personhood legislation in the SC Senate, designed to establish justice for all pre-birth human beings by

recognizing the Creator God-given unalienable right to life of every human being as a "person",

in law,

at fertilization, and that without exception, because God's Word says, "Thou shalt not kill (murder)."

Exodus 20:13, KJV. If children in the womb are vested with legal personhood, then under the Constitution

of this State, they cannot be deprived of their lives without due process and equal protection of the law.

The two Republican candidates pledged to completely support Personhood legislation were: Benjamin Dunn and Christian Stegmaier; both are professing Christians and attorneys. In the GOP

Primary August 14, as you may already be aware, Benjamin Dunn came in first, but did not exceed

50% of the vote to win the Primary outright. Therefore he will be competing in the August 28 Runoff

with John Holler, who came in second.

You can read the statement signed by Benjamin Dunn in the enclosed ad published in the new newspaper called The Standard, which hopefully most of you as pastors have seen as copies have

been distributed to 20 or so churches recently. Benjamin Dunn has committed himself to co-sponsor

Personhood legislation, and support it at every opportunity in the legislative process. On the other hand,

John Holler is not a pledged supporter of Personhood legislation to END child-murder by "abortion" in

South Carolina.

Mr. Holler, who is a United Methodist minister, stated regarding "abortion":

"I've struggled with that over a long period of time. My stance is I believe in the sanctity of life. I've always been on the side of the most vulnerable; to me, life does begin at conception. But ... if we outlaw abortion what we're going to have is a lot of unwanted children. I don't think people on one side or the other think about what that's going to mean to us as a society.

That means thousands and thousands of 'throwaway children.' ... If we say 'no abortion,' are we going to commit the resources we need to give children a chance?" [CCL: emphasis added]

This flawed position seems to reckon without God. God has already spoken on the matter to mankind. Jesus

Christ said, "Thou shalt do no murder,..." Matthew 19:18, KJV. Perhaps if we restored respect for the sanctity

of life in our culture, we would see less children as "unwanted", and more as cherished. I believe we would also

see less violence of all kinds in our society. The Bible says, "... blood toucheth blood". Hosea 4:2, KJV.

Note: The United Methodist "Church" statement on "abortion", while giving lipservice to the God-given sanctity of human life ("Our belief in the sanctity of unborn human life makes us reluctant to approve abortion."), nevertheless, at the end of the day, comes down on the side of supporting "legalized" [sic] child-murder in the womb by "abortion" ("We recognize tragic conflicts of life with life that may justify abortion, and in such cases we support the legal option of abortion under proper medical procedures by certified medical providers.") [CCL: emphasis added]

During the 20 years we have been pursuing Personhood legislation in the SC State House, the prior officeholder of the SC Senate District 20 seat never once co-sponsored Personhood legislation in the years it was filed in the SC Senate (1998 and 2005 through 2018). Now we have I believe a God-ordained opportunity to pick up another pro-Personhood SC Senate seat, if God's people prove willing in the day of His power (Psalm 110:3, KJV).

Thank you if you alerted and informed and reminded the saints of your congregations to vote and to vote righteously in the August 14 Primary two days ago. In Jesus' Name, I am asking you to please equip the saints and alert and inform and remind Christians to vote and to vote righteously on Tuesday, August 28. Amen.

CCL Comment :

In other words, there were 60,766 Registered Voters (89.43%) in Senate District #20 who did NOT cast a ballot for either the Republican or the Democrat August 14 Primary.

Note:

There were 3,290 Total Democrat Votes counted for the three candidates in the

Democrat Primary,
of which the predominant candidate was pro-"abortion" Dick Harpootlian, receiving 2,654
(80.67%).

So the four Republican candidates received a total of 3,875 votes, while the three
Democrat candidates
received a total of 3,290 votes in the August 14 Primaries.

CCL Comments :

Dunn and Stegmaier are the two pledged Personhood candidates.
Dunn was seen by CCL as the strongest Pro-Personhood candidate.

Note: Stegmaier was only 119 votes behind Holler out of 3,875 votes cast for the
four Republican candidates. That is how close it was to a preferred Dunn-Stegmaier
Runoff
between the two pledged Personhood candidates.

Hopefully Dunn will now seek and receive the backing of Stegmaier for the August 28
Runoff
between Christian attorney Benjamin Dunn and United Methodist minister John Holler.
