## An Update on the Tri-State Water Wars

As SEC football fans prepare to watch the University of Florida take on the University of Georgia in Jacksonville, Florida, this weekend, another long-standing rivalry between the two states may be nearing resolution. This faceoff won't take place on the gridiron and is not likely to draw thousands of spectators.

Rather, the rivalry will be settled by the Supreme Court of the United States and is being closely watched by the legal community and water rights experts across the country.

A decades-long dispute over water resource allocation from the Apalachicola-Chattahoochee-Flint River Basin, *State of Florida v. State of Georgia* is set to go to trial on Monday, October 31. The trial will take place at the United States Bankruptcy Court for the District of Maine in Portland, Maine. Before the trial kicks off, read up on the history of the newest battle in the **tri-state water wars**.
