PDM US Corp. establishes new facility in York County *\$1.33 million investment expected to create 20 new jobs*

COLUMBIA, S.C. – PDM US Corp., a manufacturer of pre-insulated copper pipe, today announced that it is establishing a new production facility in York County. The \$1.33 million investment is expected to generate 20 new jobs.

“We are excited about our new operations in York County. We’ve seen demand for our products increase in the U.S. market, and this new facility will go a long way in helping us better serve our customers. South Carolina offers us a great business environment and the skilled workforce talent we need. We appreciate all the support we’ve received from state and local officials,” said Pasquale De Martino, vice president of PDM US.

PDM US Corp. is establishing new operations in the former Samuel Strapping building in Rock Hill, located at 640 Cel River Rd. The company will produce pre-insulated copper pipe, and will serve as the company’s first U.S. manufacturing facility. The company expects the plant to be fully operational by June 1.

“South Carolina continues to attract companies that are starting new operations. We celebrate PDM US Corp.’s decision to put down roots here by investing \$1.33 million and creating 20 new jobs in Rock Hill. Announcements like this one show that South Carolina is the new ‘it’ state for business and that our economic development efforts are on the right track,” said Gov. Nikki Haley.

Since January 2011, South Carolina has recruited more than \$9 billion in capital investment and more than 23,000 jobs in the manufacturing sector.
