This week, PPF staff came across a long but worthwhile read, *The Anglosphere Miracle* by British M.P. Daniel Hannan, excerpted from his new book *Inventing Freedom: How the English-Speaking People Made the Modern World*.

*"Elected parliaments, habeas corpus, free contract, equality before the law, open markets, an unrestricted press, the right to proselytize for any religion, jury trials: These things are not somehow the natural condition of an advanced society. They are specific products of a political ideology developed in the language in which you are reading these words. The fact that those ideas, and that language, have become so widespread can make us lose sight of how exceptional they were in origin."*

*"We are still experiencing the after-effects of an astonishing event. The inhabitants of a damp island at the western tip of the Eurasian landmass stumbled upon the idea that the government ought to be subject to the law, not the other way around. The rule of law created security of property and contract which, in turn, led to industrialization and modern capitalism. For the first time in the history of the species, a system grew up which, on the whole, rewarded production better than predation. That system proved to be highly adaptable. It was taken across the oceans by English-speakers, sometimes imposed by colonial administrators, sometimes carried by patriotic*

*settlers. In the old courthouse in Philadelphia, it was distilled into its purest and most sublime form as the U.S. Constitution."*
