BACKGROUND:

Event: Harvest Hope Food Bank's 35th Anniversary Gala celebrating over three decades of feeding the hungry in 20 South Carolina counties. Mary King and Len Kiese from WIS will be the guest emcees for the event. The guest celebrity is Mario Lopez and he will be doing red carpet interviews with gala invitees. The event will feature live and silent auctions presented by WHIP Fundraising and entertainment provided by Blues Traveler. This event will recognize leaders in the fight to end hunger in South Carolina and thank those who have helped Harvest Hope in providing over 2.4 million meals during the October flood disaster.

Award: The late Michael J. Mungo, founder of Mungo Homes, was also one of the founding members of Harvest Hope Food Bank. In 1981, Mr. Mungo, along with a group of similarly minded community leaders, recognized the need to feed the hungry in their community and to give back to those in need. The Michael J. Mungo Humanitarian Award recognizes an individual who has displayed great courage, enthusiasm, and passion on a personal level while serving as an advocate for the hungry in South Carolina.

However, this is not an annual award and will only be given when someone demonstrates the same passion for serving as Mr. Mungo did to those in need in our state. Governor Haley was selected as the inaugural recipient of the Michael J. Mungo Humanitarian Award due to her leadership and hands-on approach in responding to South Carolina's 1,000 year flood in October of 2015 and her on-going passion and caring nature for the citizens of this state. Harvest Hope is honored to present this award to Governor Haley, as she sets the bar very high for future award recipients.

TALKING POINTS:

- It's a tremendous honor to be here with you today, and to accept this award.
- Following the flood, we asked people to step up and to come together, be it with donations of money, food and supplies, or time. And they did exactly that.
- We had first responders putting their lives on the line for others and we had millions of dollars coming from all corners of the state because South Carolinians wanted to help each other.
- In one of the most vulnerable times in our state's history, we didn't see an uptick in crime or looting. Instead, we saw neighbors helping neighbors – showing the love South Carolinians have for one another to the entire world, and that is what I am most proud of.
- That's why I'm so proud of the work done by Harvest Hope Food Bank – it is the embodiment of the generosity of the citizens of this state stepping it up.
- In the storms aftermath, Harvest Hope experienced abnormal demand as meal output was almost 200% of what they typically send out.
- They did not panic and did not falter. Instead, they rolled up their sleeves and got to work.
- I was blessed to have the opportunity to witness this work first hand when my staff and I spent time at Harvest Hope helping unload donated supplies and packing food boxes.
- **Since that time, Harvest Hope has provided over 2,300,000 meals to disaster victims, and has set up Emergency Mobile Food Pantries that have helped thousands of families.**
- I couldn't be more proud of our citizens for their generosity or of Harvest Hope for their work serving the less fortunate throughout this state, and especially for their work in the wake of the October floods.
