Lesson learned. You are never too old to play dress-up with your friends. Ladies, this adventure is definitely on the girlie side, but we saw gentlemen on the day we visited, and those guys were having a fine time, too.

That said, here's the scenario. Make reservations. Gather a few of your best girlfriends, or the book club, and head for Ridgeway, a tiny town about 20 miles north of Columbia that fairly oozes with Southern charm.

You'll walk into a charming gift shop and deli, but save that for after the tea. You'll be sent upstairs, via the landing and cutout of Queen Elizabeth, suitable for photo fun. Pick out a hat if you didn't wear your own. I wore my lovely little black straw, but must confess I looked longingly at the hats with veils. So sexy! You'll find cloches, wide-brims, garden

chapeaus, and a few, frankly strange concoctions. One will speak to you and, with the queen's most realistic look of approval, you'll head up from the landing to choose your cup and saucer from a dazzling variety. Properly equipped, you'll be shown your table.

The tea will arrive first and it changes daily. Our adorable tea pot contained a blueberry hibiscus brew – delish! Our group ordered a black tea as well, which was well-liked by some. The first course was a salad, with strawberries. Next, we received a small, chilled cup of strawberry soup, plus a tiny lemon scone. After a rather lengthy pause, our tea sandwiches arrived, enough for six tidbits each. My favorite was turkey with pesto, but others preferred the tomato and pimiento cheese, or chicken salad. Another tiered tray arrived last, holding six sweets for each of us. The portions are tiny, but the volume ample for a full lunch. And if you don't like something, simply pass.

The presentation was lovely, and the service measured. "We want you to slow down and relax," our server said. A bit more than two hours after it started, we walked downstairs and shopped for tea, cookbooks, linens, serving platters and assorted delights – many locally made. I headed back to work, but my friends wandered Main Street and the antique shops. It was a very good day, indeed.

*WOW Factor:* the building, the presentation, and the tea. It really is perfectly brewed. You'll step back in time and become one of those original ladies who lunch, at least for a bit.

*Hint:* Do not, we repeat, do not plan a visit to Laura's Tea Room on a day when you're short on time. They plan a long leisurely event and don't turn the tables. You are told to allow two hours, and it takes every bit of that and more. Wear (or borrow) a hat. It just adds to the fun.

## Bill Murray

Born September 21, 1950

He was so funny on *Saturday Night Live* – creating characters that made you laugh and watching him play off others in the ensemble cast. *Caddyshack* was wildly popular, but it was *Ghostbusters* that propelled him into superstardom. I, however, fell in love with him in *Groundhog Day*, where we watched him morph from burned-out boredom to a compassionate, fully alive altruist. His repertoire expanded with roles in *Ed Wood* and *Rushmore*, and he earned an Academy Award nomination, a Golden Globe Award and a British Academy of Film and Television Arts award for his remarkable role in *Lost in Translation*. I loved that one, too. There were other award nominations and accolades, including a Primetime Emmy for his role in HBO's *Olive Kitteredge*.

More recently, he's received acclaim for his roles in *Moonrise Kingdom*, *Grand Budapest Hotel*, and *St. Vincent*.

The Carolinas can't claim Bill Murray as a native son, but he has adopted Charleston SC – at least for part of the time. He sported a locally created Charleston-born Brackish Bow Tie at the 2014 academy awards. He's been spotted dropping in on special events, and encouraging young people he meets on the street. From a variety of news reports – and clearly, a bit of good-natured stalking by fans seeking to catch a glimpse and take a selfie – Bill Murray and Charleston are well-suited for one another.

Born in Illinois and raised in a northern suburb of Chicago, he was one of nine children in a Catholic Irish American family. Divorced, he is the father of six boys. As part owner of the team, he can often be seen at a Charleston River Dogs baseball game.

## South Carolina: Fairest Fairways of Them All

***Four special awards and the announcement of this year's top 50 golf courses in South Carolina show why the state is a favorite permanent stopping point for baby boomers relocating to the Southern region of the country.***

Most of the 125 members of the South Carolina Golf Rating Panel met at the Wild Dunes Resort on Isle of Palms over the first weekend in March to test the resort's recently renovated Links Course, to play its other 18-hole layout, the Harbor Course, and to hear the results of the group's voting for the best golf courses in the state for 2016.

The Panel, which comprises golf professionals, passionate amateur golfers, and South Carolinians who work in golf-related industries, named the Ocean Course at Kiawah Island the top layout in the state among both private and publicly accessible golf

The couple's daughter, Devon, was born during summer session in 1992, and grew up within the Penland community.

Mr. Fero has been a flameworker for more than 40 years, and maintains a studio next to the school. He participates in international symposia and conferences, and has taught in prestigious institutions worldwide.

His work can be found internationally, in public and private collections, as well as in more than 20 museum collections, including those in Denmark, Germany, Japan, the Asheville Art Museum and more. He's past president of the Board of Directors of the Glass Art Society and received their Lifetime Membership Award in Chicago, in 2014.
