Child Support Enforcement Project Talking Points with HP May 7, 2013

1. HP's Involvement with Contract

- While Saber Corporation was the original vendor to the August 2007 CFS contract, EDS completed the purchase of Saber on November 30, 2007. HP completed the purchase of EDS on August 28, 2008. HP corporate staff has been responsible for the project for more than 5 years.
- Frank Chechile, HP corporate VP, executed the first 2 contract extensions (2009 and 2011) on behalf of EDS/HP and HP, respectively; Mike Poth, VP over State and Local Enterprise Division of HP, executed the third contract amendment in 2012.

2. Contract Extensions

- Original contract was for a period of 36 months.
- First Contract Extension - Extended contract from 36 months to 52 months.
- Second Contract Extension - Extended contract from 52 months to 68 months.
- Third Contract Extension - Extended contract from 68 months to 73 months. (HP should have completed Systems Test by November 2012 and Statewide Deployment by August 2013. HP is currently halfway through Systems Test.)

3. What does the State want from HP?

- Provide a realistic schedule;
- Finish the project in a quality manner with strong leadership and skilled staff;

- Commit to paying:
 - any additional federal penalties incurred as a result of missing the federal implementation deadline of September 30 in 2013 and 2014; and
 - costs incurred by the State and Clerks of Court due to project extension.
