

ROLE AND FUNCTIONS OF COMMITTEE ON LEGISLATIVE RELATIONS

1. Background. This standing committee was created in August, 1972.
2. Role. The role of the committee is to provide guidance to the Commission and staff in promoting and maintaining good relations with the General Assembly and in securing passage of legislation of importance to post-secondary education.
3. Functions.
 - a. To present each year to the Commission a legislative plan of action to guide the Commission during the next session of the General Assembly.
 - b. To supervise the staff's monitoring of legislative actions.
 - c. To foster good relationships with members of the General Assembly in so far as feasible.
 - d. To consult, on a regular basis, with appropriate members of the General Assembly, determining their views on matters pending before the Commission and presenting to them the Commission's views on matters of interest to the Commission pending in the Legislature.
