Thanks for the call earlier today. Just a little bit about our company...
Manchester Farms is a 2nd generation, family owned Quail farm celebrating our 40 year in business here in SC. My wife Brittney's parent's Bill and Janet Odom started the business back in the early 70's as a way to sell some of the quail that Bill raised to train his quail hunting dogs. Every year he would process and sell the remaining birds to family and friends. Fast forward 40 years, we now hatch and process over 4 million quail a year or about 100,000 quail a week. We are 100% vertically integrated with our own Breeder Farm, our own state of the art hatchery, grow out facilities and our own processing facility. We employ between 125-150 people annually. We also produce a number of non-quail items like bacon wrapped chicken, Bo jangle's Pork chop 's, King and Prince Bacon wrapped shrimp just to name a few. We would love to have you and the Governor come see our operation sometime in the future to see how our small family farm produces food that is distributed nationwide and employ's many good people right here in Richland county.
