

S.C. Farmers should buy winter hay now

Start stocking up.


At least that's what one Clemson agronomist suggests to livestock farmers who will need hay this winter.

Bruce Pinkerton, a Clemson Extension agronomist/forage expert, said two consecutive years of unfavorable weather have led to a short supply of hay in South Carolina. As a result, he said, it would be wise for farmers to buy their hay now and store it for winter, instead of buying it on an as-needed basis.

"Weather has just not cooperated for two years now," he said.

Standing water in the spring of 1998, cool conditions early this season, armyworms and drought-like conditions have collectively reduced hay volume in the state for this year. Unfortunately, many of the same conditions have affected hay production in states along the Eastern Seaboard, and many farmers in those states are looking to our hay producers. But South Carolina is generally a hay-deficit state — meaning that more hay is consumed than we produce. To feed our livestock, we usually import hay to supplement what our farmers produce.

Les Tindal, Commissioner of Agriculture, is also urging livestock owners to buy and store hay now.



"Many farmers from outside the state have already been looking for hay in South Carolina," he said. "We must meet the needs for our own livestock. Then, if we should have a surplus, we should assist other states."

The severity of a possible hay shortage all depends on the coming winter, Pinkerton said. The longer the winter season lasts, the higher the demand on hay and, subsequently, the higher price farmers will pay for the forage.

"We're going into winter with a short supply," Pinkerton said.

Besides stocking up now for winter, Pinkerton suggests looking into alternative forages, such as cottonseed and corn. These options can be very nutritional for livestock, though it's important to know which nutrients the animals receive from each food to ensure they get proper nourishment.

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Commissioner's Column

Volunteers make it happen

South Carolina's youth continue to impress me. As I stated in my last column, I was very impressed by the teenagers who were elected Boys State and Girls State agriculture commissioners this year. Very soon after, we all heard more good news: a teenage girl from Sumter, Leah Frederick, was elected president of Girls Nation by her fellow Girls Nation representatives. She became eligible for the presidency after being elected Girls State governor of South Carolina. Also, South Carolina's other representative to Girls Nation, Mary Ellen Player, was elected Most Outstanding Senator.

We are in the middle of an era where political apathy has taken hold of many of our teenagers, but the Boys State/Girls State programs are doing something about that. All over the state, American Legion and American Legion Auxiliary members select some of our brightest students to take part in the week-long program that gives students first-hand knowledge of how our government works. And though the students work hard to be chosen for the program, it's the adults who volunteer their free time who make these programs so successful.

Florence Belser, an attorney for the Public Service Commission, has been especially instrumental in training the young girls who are chosen for the Girls State program. As the director for South Carolina's Girls State Program for six years, Florence coordinates the week-long camp, which includes an intensive study of U.S. political processes and participation in a mock government. Florence books lodging for the girls at Columbia College, arranges meals, classes and everything else involved in putting the program together, according to Molly Spearman, who serves on the Girls State Committee and is Deputy Superintendent of Education. There are four committee members, excluding Florence, who help with the program.

"Ninety-eight percent of the work falls on her shoulders," Molly said. "Any other camp would have someone full-time doing this work, and Florence does it in her leisure time — with no pay."

As both of these women have learned, when you give your time to help our youth, you are constantly rewarded as you watch them become successes.

"It's a good feeling," Molly said. "It makes me realize we have many fine young people in South Carolina who are going to be able to lead our state and nation into the future."

Florence became involved in Girls State when she participated in the program in high school. Since then, she's moved up the ranks, becoming a junior counselor, a senior counselor, educational director and finally the director of Girls State. And she didn't stop there. For a few years Florence served on the Girls Nation staff, as did Molly. That means giving up 7 days each year for Girls State camp, then giving up another 10 days to attend Girls Nation.

"The Girls State program has improved tremendously in the past few years, and much of that is due to the leadership of Florence Belser," Molly said.

In addition to Florence's contributions, each of the 48 counselors that helped with camp this year used their personal time to help these girls familiarize themselves with politics.

"The best thing the girls gain is a network of friends who are highly motivated. They also gain a great deal of confidence in their abilities, learn how to present themselves, learn how to get involved in government and get a greater appreciation for what it means to be an American citizen," Molly said.

I think parents are lucky that so many people give so much of their time to ensure children have these types of educational experiences. I also think that more adults should follow their lead by volunteering for youth organizations. How can we criticize the actions of teenagers if we're not involved in their lives? The burden is on us to teach our youth the things they need to thrive as adults. How else are they to learn?

Farming the old way

Homemade Fig Bars

Ingredients: Filling — 1 cup sugar, 8 oz. dried figs finely chopped, 1/2 cup nuts finely chopped (optional), 1/2 cup water. Crumb crust and topping — 1 cup brown sugar, 1/2 cup margarine or butter, 1/2 teaspoon salt, 1/2 teaspoon vanilla, 2 1/4 cups all-purpose flour, divided, 1 3/4 cups rolled oats.

Filling: Combine sugar, dried figs, nuts and water in a medium saucepan. Heat to boiling; reduce heat and simmer 10 minutes or until thickened, stirring frequently. Set aside to cool.
Crumb crust and topping: Cream sugar and margarine together until light and fluffy. Add salt and vanilla; mix until blended. Stir in 1 3/4 cups flour and oats until well mixed and crumbly. Spread and pat two-thirds flour mixture evenly into ungreased 9x13x2-inch pan. Spread filling evenly on top. Add 1/2 cup flour to remaining flour mixture; crumble and spread all over. Bake at 350° F for 25-30 minutes, or until lightly brown. Allow to cool in pan; cut into bars. Makes 30 bars.

Fig Preserves

Wash and destem figs. Using twice as many figs as sugar, simmer until desired thickness. Pack into sterilized jars and seal with sterilized lids.
