Governor's Proclamation

- WHEREAS,** the use of alcohol is the number one cause of harm to unborn babies in South Carolina; and
- WHEREAS,** approximately one in every 300 babies in the Palmetto State is born with Fetal Alcohol Syndrome, and one in every 50 has a wider range of alcohol-related neurodevelopmental challenges and other birth defects known as Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders; and
- WHEREAS,** Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders are irreversible, lifelong conditions found among babies whose mothers consumed alcohol during pregnancy and are the leading cause of intellectual disability; and
- WHEREAS,** the physical, mental, and cognitive effects of Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders are totally preventable; and
- WHEREAS,** Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders require a multi-level approach for diagnosis and interventions to prevent the secondary disabilities that devastate individuals, families, communities, and state resources; and
- WHEREAS,** the use of new scientific information can help states rise to the challenges of prevention, diagnosis, and assisting those affected by Fetal Alcohol Syndrome and Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Nikki R. Haley, Governor of the Great State of South Carolina, do hereby proclaim September 9, 2013, as

FETAL ALCOHOL SPECTRUM DISORDERS AWARENESS DAY

throughout the state and encourage all South Carolinians to work together to help ensure the brightest possible future for the children of the Palmetto State.
