Gov. Bentley of Alabama and Gov. Deal of Georgia have issued states of emergency in regards to fuel availability and potential shortages. A statement from Colonial Pipeline, the owner of the pipeline that spilled, said that South Carolina would be among the first states affected by any "potential disruption in supply."
