in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) Gold Certification. The new headquarters was designed with three key factors in mind: Sustainability, Health and Wellbeing, and Mars Associates. The building reused 60 percent of the existing interior and materials to conserve resources, and motion-activated lights, desk lamps, and LED bulbs were incorporated to reduce lighting usage by 45 percent. In addition, the office encourages alternate commuting options for Associates by promoting bike racks and carpool parking and by subsidizing a bus route.

Mars Food recently accepted the Corporate Excellence Award from the American Carbon Registry (ACR) at their 100th annual gala for its leadership in addressing climate change through sustainable sourcing commitments across its supply chain. The commitments, which focus on sustainable rice sourcing, are part of

an ambitious goal to source all rice from farmers working towards the Sustainable Rice Platform standard by 2020. To meet this goal, and increase the overall quality of rice, Mars invested in research and farmer education, and is partnering with growers, NGOs, and universities to transform the production of rice farms, enhance water use, and reduce greenhouse gas emissions to improve yields and increase incomes.

Mars was a feature sponsor of this year's Bentonville Film Festival (BFF), an annual event dedicated to championing women and diverse voices in media.

"Pet-Friendly City of the Future" exhibit, attracting over 1,000 dogs and their owners to the exhibit. Mars Petcare featured pet adoptions with approximately 70 dogs being adopted throughout the weekend.
