Home visiting expansion

In September 2013, Children's Trust of South Carolina was awarded almost \$14.4 million over the next three years to expand home visiting programs in the state. The South Carolina Maternal, Infant and Early Childhood Home Visiting (SCMIECHV) expansion grant will increase access to abuse prevention, health and learning readiness services for close to 1,300 families and result in more than 40 new jobs. The funds were awarded by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (Health Resources and Services Administration Grant # D89MC26365; CFDA #: 93.505).

Children's Trust will build upon the established "hub and spoke" approach to reach rural communities through metropolitan and perinatal regional centers to connect resources to high-risk areas that lack strong resources. Partnerships and models that are part of the expansion plan include Family Check Up, Healthy Steps, Healthy Families America, Nurse Family Partnership and Help Me Grow.

Children's Trust of South Carolina has contracted with the Rural Health Research Center at the University of South Carolina's Arnold School of Public Health to evaluate the programs.
