The State: One SC Fund awards grants to nonprofits for flood recovery

The One SC Flood Relief Fund has awarded its first round of grants, totaling \$500,000, to support more than a dozen nonprofits working on recovery from the historic flooding on Oct. 4. The 13 nonprofits who received grant money are based in hard-hit areas across South Carolina.

Note: “We’ve asked the people of South Carolina to step up, and what we’ve seen so far is the best in our state – but there’s more work to be done,” Gov. Nikki Haley said in the release. “If you were blessed and did not have damage to your home, if you were blessed and able to get back into a safe place, pay it forward. Give whatever you can to support the One SC Flood Relief Fund.”

South Carolina business leaders said Wednesday a gas tax increase is a necessary part of any legislative funding solution for crumbling state infrastructure. S.C. Chamber of Commerce President Ted Pitts said the pro-business organization has not endorsed a specific increase to the current 16.75 cents per gallon tax on motor fuel that funds roads and infrastructure.

Note: The Senate bill didn't include any DOT reforms or a 2 percentage point income tax reduction to offset the gas tax increase, as Gov. Nikki Haley has proposed.
