Governor Haley wanted to update you on the gasoline supply issues that are affecting the Southeast caused by a leak in Line 1 of the Colonial Pipeline, which transports gasoline from the Gulf Coast to the Southeast and Eastern Seaboard.

Our office has taken the following actions to minimize the potential impact of gasoline supply delays on consumers and to further expedite the delivery of fuel in South Carolina: On Wednesday, September 14th, the Governor issued Executive Order 2016-21 to waive Hours of Service requirements for commercial truck drivers; today, the Governor issued Executive Order 2016-23 to waive Size and Weight limitations for commercial truck drivers as well as to extend the waiver for Hours of Service requirements; and additionally, the Department of Agriculture is issuing waivers to companies regarding certain fuel specifications as requested.

Governor Haley and our staff have been in regular communication with Colonial Pipeline, Office of Regulatory Staff, Department of Transportation, Department of Agriculture, Attorney General's Office, and U.S. Department of Energy as well as industry partners and associations. While South Carolina is experiencing some delays in fuel supply in isolated instances mostly in rural areas and some urban areas, no long-term delays are expected and no widespread supply concerns have been reported—so long as consumers maintain routine and regular activity.

For your information, the Governor's Office issued the following statement to the public today:

"The governor, who is working with state officials and industry leaders to monitor fuel supply issues, today issued an executive order waiving federal transportation regulations to ensure expedited fuel delivery. Consumers can and should purchase fuel as they would normally – and as engineers work to repair pipeline issues, we will continue to monitor developments in the region."

Our office will continue to monitor supply and price issues around the state and will take additional actions as needed. Please let us know if you have any questions.
