What is the memorandum of understanding with the governor's office and SLED when it comes to reimbursement for the governor's security for campaign events?

Find the document attached.

How come there hasn't been a reimbursement to any state agency (SLED, DNR, DPS) since Jan. 2015? The governor made several trips throughout the country, besides those listed below, in 2015.

On background: Reimbursements are being made today for the 2015-2016 time period. The reimbursements will cover federal and state campaign events. The Movement Fund is making those reimbursements.

"When the governor stopped running an active campaign for re-election by the end of 2014, she stopped regularly attending campaign events, and a quarterly review of campaign-related security costs became inefficient - in 2015, the total reimbursable costs for the year were only \$142.23. These costs were paid in conjunction with recent reimbursable costs, and, now that she has begun attending more campaign events for other candidates this year, a quarterly review of security costs will continue."

Why are there inconsistencies in what is added to her public schedule a week after the event?

"This is the governor's public schedule. If an event that wasn't open to the public was later published by the press, we reflect that in the schedule so as to provide as accurate a record as possible of the known events she attended."
