As of yesterday (February 10, 2014) our internal excel sheet documents the following:

- 236 vouchers have been sent out (some persons have died or entered nursing homes)
- Out of a projected annual budget of \$114,400
  - \$112,000.00 has been committed
  - \$ 57,513.42 has been billed
  - \$ 2,400.00 has yet to be allocated but should be committed shortly.

We will be monitoring persons who do not appear to be using their funds and will re-allocate those funds.
