WHEREAS, approximately 80,000 Americans are legally blind from glaucoma and many more are vision-impaired from this disease; and


WHEREAS, early detection and appropriate, effective treatment can prevent vision loss from glaucoma; and

WHEREAS, during the 2001 observance of National Eye Care Month, the American Academy of Ophthalmology, the South Carolina Society of Ophthalmology, and the Eye M.D.s of the United States of America will sponsor events designed to communicate this important message to the public – “SEE! Protect your eyes from glaucoma, the sneak thief of sight”.
