Governor's Proclamation

WHEREAS, World AIDS Day is an international campaign held each year on the first day of December to raise awareness of the global impact of HIV/AIDS; and

WHEREAS, approximately 1.2 million Americans are living with HIV or AIDS, and nearly one in seven people do not know they are infected; and

WHEREAS, at the end of 2014, almost 16,000 residents of South Carolina, including nearly 200 children and teens, were living with HIV or AIDS; and

WHEREAS, with the theme, "Getting to Zero," the 2015 observance of World AIDS Day calls attention to the importance of working together to increase prevention and treatment to win the fight against this global pandemic.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Nikki R. Haley, Governor of the great State of South Carolina, do hereby proclaim December 1, 2015, as

WORLD AIDS DAY

throughout the state and encourage all South Carolinians to learn more about HIV/AIDS, take action to protect their health and the health of others, treat HIV/AIDS patients with fairness and understanding, and remember those who have lost their lives to this disease.
