The State: SC Governor Tells SC State Trustees To Settle Differences

Gov. Nikki Haley urged S.C. State University trustees Friday to build trust and accountability at the beleaguered college, struggling to overcome a \$6 million budget deficit, falling enrollment and a fraud scandal. Taking the unusual step of calling together a college board to hear its concerns directly, Haley said the state's only public historically black university needs to share a game plan soon with the public.

Note: "You can't keep going the way you have been going," Haley, an ex-officio member of the Orangeburg university's board, said during a meeting on the State House grounds... Haley told the trustees that she thinks they have a passion to help S.C. State. "But, at some point, you have to just put (differences) aside," she said. "If there was ever a time for you all to step up, it's now. And I've got you back, but you have to make some hard decisions."

Democratic Gov. Martin O'Malley of Maryland will unleash a blistering critique of his Republican counterpart in South Carolina, Nikki Haley, in remarks to a Democratic party conference in Charleston on Saturday. O'Malley plans to attack Haley, who is up for re-election next year, as "tea party Republican" who cares more about voter ID laws than expanding health care access and education for South Carolinians, according to early excerpts of his speech provided to CNN.

Note: Asked about O'Malley's salvo, Haley adviser Tim Pearson said the state's unemployment rate has dropped two points since Haley took office in 2010. "He should go back to Maryland where he quite successfully legalized gambling, gay marriage, the end of the death penalty, and hiked taxes on everyone and everything he could think of," Pearson said of O'Malley. "And you can quote me on the record with all of that."

The campaign also said it discovered unreported payments totaling \$66,797 to 16 vendors – much of which went to a pair of firms that handled television production and consulting.

The campaign of State Attorney General Alan Wilson inadvertently left off dozens of contributions and expenses totaling more than \$134,000 from campaign disclosure reports because of "clerical errors," its officials now say. The errors were discovered as the result of Wilson's decision last month to return campaign contributions tied to House Speaker Bobby Harrell after Wilson asked the State Law Enforcement Division to look into allegations of ethics violations by Harrell, which Harrell has denied. Wilson discovered then that one of the donations had not been disclosed on campaign reports.

The Senate on Saturday narrowly passed its first federal budget in four years, a move that will usher in a relative lull in Washington's fiscal wars until an anticipated summer showdown over raising the debt ceiling. The budget plan was passed by a 50-49 vote in the Democratic-controlled chamber. Four Democratic senators facing tough re-election campaigns in 2014 joined all the Senate Republicans in opposing the measure, which seeks to raise nearly \$1 trillion in new tax revenues by closing some tax breaks for the wealthy.
