Gov. Nikki Haley Announces South Carolina Christmas Challenge *Challenges South Carolinians To Perform Random Acts Of Kindness*

COLUMBIA, SC – Governor Nikki Haley announced the South Carolina Christmas Challenge yesterday at the 47th Annual Governor's Carolighting. In recounting the numerous examples of South Carolinians reaching out to their fellow neighbors and lending a helping hand, the governor issued a statewide challenge to perform a random act of kindness during this holiday season.

"I want to challenge each and every family to do one random act of kindness. Whether it's having a soldier for dinner because they don't have a family nearby to go to, visiting a nursing home, or baking cookies for an elderly neighbor, each act of kindness can help affect our state for the better," said Gov.
