



## Revised Talking Points – Conference of Black Mayors (Version 1)

- Lead in – As leaders of your communities, you face challenges that many other mayors do not – (Coble, Riley, White)
- TY – for your willingness to serve, for your leadership, for accepting responsibility
- Problems faced by your communities are startling when you look at the numbers:

### **Problems – Economic Disparities:**

- According to 2000 Census, blacks in SC are earning about 50 cents on the white dollar.
- Per capita income: Black - \$11,776                      White - \$22,095
- Homeownership: Black – 16.2 %                      White – 54.8 %
- Percent below Poverty: Black – 26.3 %                      White – 8.5 %

### **Problems – Educational Disparities:**

- Statewide, the percentage of white residents with a high school diploma is 15% higher than for black residents
- Put another way, 80 percent of white South Carolinians have a high school degree. About 65 percent of black South Carolinians have a high school degree.
- College Graduates: Black – 9.9 %                      White – 24.2 %
- In all but **six of your towns**, the percentage of black residents with a high school diploma is exceeded by the percent white of residents with a high school diploma. The same trend holds true with college degrees – in only **seven of your towns** does the percentage of black residents with college degrees exceed the percentage of white residents with college degrees.

### **Problems – Health Disparities:**

- Minorities are more than two times more likely to experience diabetes than are white persons and three times more likely to die from the disease.
- Minority infants in South Carolina are more than twice as likely to die before their first birthday than white babies
- Minorities are 1.5 times more likely to die of stroke in SC than are whites. (South Carolina is first in the nation for deaths due to stroke.)
- African Americans are more than twice as likely to visit the Emergency Room due to complications of cardiovascular disease than whites

## 2. Department of Disease Management at HHS (Established in '03)

- Launching a low-birth weight initiative for improved education and outreach
- Initiating obesity-related efforts with community partners and medical schools in SC as this is a leading risk factor for cardiovascular disease
- Developing specific diabetes education pilots in the Low Country and Midlands to utilize local pharmacists in providing one-one-one education to beneficiaries on site
- Working with physician groups for a targeted launch of awareness for appropriate testing to help prevent diabetes progression to chronic kidney disease
- Pilot programs for education in several regions of the state emphasizing getting blood pressure checked and taking prescribed medicine and/or making lifestyle changes

## 3. Agency Restructuring

- Did you know we have eight healthcare agencies in South Carolina, and between those agencies we have almost twice the number of secretaries as we do nurses?
- Proposed consolidating all of those into three agencies to better streamline delivery of services to our citizens

## Eliminating Disparities – Education

- Strong believer that the best way to fix education in this state is by offering parents more choices – one size doesn't fit all, and parents are often the least listened-to educational experts in this country

### Example 1 -- <sup>school choice program</sup> Milwaukee (enacted 1990)

- Of voucher recipients -- 76% come from single-parent homes, 92% are minority, and had an average family income: \$11,630.
- -A 1997 Harvard University study found that students in the voucher program for three or four years registered reading scores 3-5 percentile points higher than their public school peers, and 5-12 points higher in math.

### Example 2 -- <sup>school choice program</sup> Cleveland (enacted 1995)

- Of voucher recipients -- 68% come from single-parent homes, 72% are minority, actual family income: \$15,769.
- -A 1999 Harvard University study of two of Cleveland's largest Choice schools found that, after two years, students gained 7.5 national percentile points in reading and 15.6 points in math.
