BACKGROUND: Under Governor Haley’s leadership and the direction of Judge Bill Byars, in July 2011, the South Carolina Department of Corrections implemented a new evidence-based parole service for Youthful Offenders, ages 17-25, called Intensive Supervision. Today, fully implemented Intensive Supervision Services are experiencing substantial reductions in the number of young men and women returning to prison, helping to end the generational cycle of incarceration. Throughout the life of the program, 2,102 Youthful Offenders have been assigned to Intensive Supervision and 1,730 have been paroled. Previously, this high-risk population was returning to prison at a rate of more than 50 percent. SCDC’s unique supervision program touts an impressive 13.5% 2-year recidivism rate.
