Dr. Cathine G. Scott, Prominent Educator AND World Traveler

Dr. Cathine G. Scott, born in Skippers, Virginia, learned at a very early age that education was the key to a life beyond small town Virginia. Under the tutelage of mentors who recognize Dr. Scott's drive and commitment to excellence, led her to being recognized as an expert in her field of teacher education as evident in the contributions she has made to her family, her students and higher education.

Dr. Scott's distinctive career has been marked by positions in education, training, and development.
