Ted,

Per our conversation last week, below are our most current estimates for both state agency total costs and cost share costs. Cost share is generally 25% with the exception of DOT which will be less than the estimates below due to a sliding scale on debris costs. DOT will get additional federal funding by removing debris within 90 days.

We have about \$1.07M in old disaster accounts that could be used to cover the cost share for all state agencies less DOT. Estimated cost share for state agencies, less DOT, is \$537,314. The authority to do so is covered under Proviso 117.62 (GP: FEMA Flexibility). Recommend you consider paying the state agency cost share for the February Winter Storm less DOT using funds in the old disaster account.
