We also provide [free interpreter services](#) to help the Spanish-speaking community conduct Social Security business in their preferred language, whether it is by phone or at their local Social Security office.

Easily accessible services are critical to our beneficiaries in the Hispanic community. Among Hispanics receiving benefits in 2013, 37 percent of elderly married couples and 62 percent of elderly unmarried persons relied on Social Security for 90 percent or more of their income.
