Re: **Request For A Hearing On The Suspension Of My State Of South Carolina**
[Class-A] Driver's License After Receipt Of The Notices Of Suspension.

To The Governor of South Carolina, I am sending this request for a **Hearing on the suspension of my drivers license.**

My South Carolina License were indeed suspended in 1998 for failure to pay {Habitual Violator Status}; At the time that the fee was due, I was incarcerated in the state of Georgia on an unrelated legal issue, that did not involve the use of my Drivers License in the state of Georgia.

However, I was not aware of the amount that was due, until I inquired into properly handling the issue, through the administrative services of your Department (December 2013); [see attachment "A"**. I was inadequately notified that the fee(s) were in excess of \$1100.00, and even considering that I am currently indigent, I would like an opportunity to have a Hearing on the matter to get it handled in the method required by law.

[T]he individual that the Commissioner designated from the Department of Motor Vehicles to be the official custodians of the records of the department extracts of the records of the department, was not properly certified.

I did not receive any other prior notice or notices of suspension issued by the Department of Motor Vehicles, and thus such could not have been certified by the individual who had been designated by the commissioner as an official custodian of safety records for the Department of Motor Vehicles. I received a letter, presumably a notice from The Department.

[T]he Department of Motor Vehicles suspended my driver's license because of failure to respond to a citation to appear before a court of competent jurisdiction for a

traffic violation, but I was incarcerated in prison in the state of Georgia. The department did not, as required, notify me that my license were suspended.

By failing to properly notify me, this inadvertently denied me the right to timely and properly request a hearing within the amount of days, (required by state law) of receipt of notice sent by certified mail.


Subsequently, since no hearing was requested in the amount of time specified by the law, the right to a hearing was not waived and my license should not be suspended, but yet reinstated. If I was not indigent I would respond and pay any and all fines or penalties imposed.

In accordance with the S.C. Dept. Of Motor Vehicles Reinstatement Requirements [see attachment "B"]; In particular, The administrative procedures utilized by the South Carolina Department of Motor Vehicles in suspending drivers' license.

At such Hearing, I will present such information deemed necessary to properly defend my reasoning for not previously being able to retain my license. The \$ 1100.00 reinstatement fee, that is required by The (S.C.D.M.V.), should be adequately assessed.

At such Hearing, I may present the completed Form MV-70, Full Identification and proof of residency. (primary address that I plan to reside at, upon my release from Georgia Department of Corrections and/of The Georgia Board of Pardons and Parole.) and any other information pertinent on this issue.



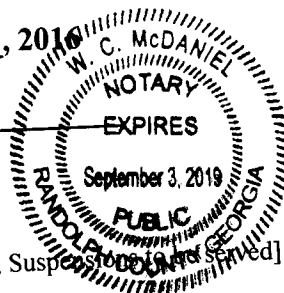
