Subject: Update on Little Pee Dee River at Galivant's Ferry

At 12:30 AM this October 11, 2016 the Little Pee Dee River at Galivant's Ferry surpassed the September 15, 1928 record highest stage of 16.0 feet

At 10:00 AM the stage was 16.55' and rising..forecast to reach 17' and remain in "Major Flood" through the 6-day forecast period

Rainfalls of 12.47 inches at Lumberton NC contributed to the highest stage known at the Lumber River at Lumberton NC of 21.87' at 7:30 AM Monday (old record 18.3')..flooding has proceeded into SC along the Lumber River and joined the Little Pee Dee below Nichols SC..

The Little Pee Dee at Galivant's Ferry has a drainage area of 2790 square miles..
