Thirty years ago, it made sense to require S.C. teens to pass the high school exit exam, a bare-bones test that ensured mastery of basic English and math skills. It had to be passed before students could receive high school diplomas. Back then, "kids were leaving high schools in our state who couldn't read or write," said Melanie Barton, director of the Education Oversight Committee, to The State newspaper. "It (the exit exam) set a minimum level of competency."
